## About Us

Town Cats was organized in 1992 in order to address the feral cat population of Ocean City, Maryland. When they went home in the fall, many summer visitors would leave behind the cats they had been feeding all summer to face the winter without food or shelter.

Those that survived would inevitably breed in the spring, producing litters of feral kittens that would eventually produce more unwanted kittens. Something had to be done to stop the litters and so Town Cats was born to spay/neuter/vaccinate the feral cats of Ocean City.

Working with abandoned and feral cats is not easy. They are not adoptable and most shelters won't take them in. When there are too many complaints about them, Animal Control will sweep in, round them up and immediately put them down.

Town Cats primary goal is to spay/neuter the feral cats we work with. In this way we humanely prevent litters of feral kittens who grow up to endlessly repeat the reproductive cycle.

Cats tend to form their own colonies, looking for places with a food supply and some kind of shelter. Once we discover such a colony we begin daily feeding, erect warm, dry shelters and begin working to get the whole colony spayed/neutered. We find good homes for the kittens and any adoptable cats, maintaining them in foster homes until adoption is finalized.

We are committed to protecting them and improving their lives in every way we can. As an associate of Alley Cat Allies, we follow their system of trap, neuter, vaccinate, return. (TNVR).

We meet on selected Tuesdays or Thursdays at Walgreens in Ocean Pines to transport cats to our clinics. Our fee is typically \$45 which includes spay/neuter, rabies, distemper and flea topical. **By appointment only!**

**\*Need To Rehome Your Cat:** We hope rehoming is a last resort but if you do, one of our adoption partners has started a new program called "Rehome". Rehome is designed to help pets go from their current home directly to their new adopter without ever entering a shelter, placing additional burden on a rescue, or ending up in dangerous hands via a classified site.

All of the cats we offer for adoption are spay/neutered, had rabies shots, been tested for feline diseases, been dewormed and treated for fleas, etc. There is a fee of \$75 to partially offset these costs.
