We get calls almost daily to come trap and rescue stray or abandoned kittens. Having to explain to someone that we are already at maximum capacity is absolutely heartbreaking on so many levels—but, unfortunately, most of our fosters are already out of room in their homes.

More education and awareness is needed regarding fostering. Fostering kittens is not difficult, and it can be so rewarding. It can also teach children compassion and responsibility, as well as a respect and value for life.

Fostering is a great way to experience a lot of the best things kittens have to offer, without the long-term responsibility of adoption. This works out great for a lot of people and in most cases, you'll only foster the kittens until they're old enough to get adopted. This can also be a good way to get a feel for what it's like to live with and care for a kitten if you're on the fence about adopting one.

Please consider helping out some of our adorable kittens. They don't need much—just a temporary placement until they can be adopted out to their forever homes through our system, or until another foster arrangement becomes available. All you need is a small space with a flat surface that can hold a 2' x 3' cage. It could be a table, a bathroom, or even a warm corner in your home away from your pets.

Town Cats takes care of all scheduled medical treatments such as shots, deworming, blood tests, flea treatments, spay/neuter and any other medical issues that may arise. 





cruel, neglectful owner threw her out into the streets to fend for herself...

We were grief-stricken to let her go, but relieved knowing she did not have to die from starvation or exposure. Help came too late for Juno.

Juno's journey doesn't have to be in vain. As we enjoy time indoors with our family, surrounded by love and warmth this winter, please remember all of the homeless cats who are left to suffer because of human neglect and indifference.

A SPECIAL HOME NEEDED FOR TWO SPECIAL GIRLS



MEET SASHA & LILA

They were found "by accident" by a young lady who moved a cat off the road after it had been hit Upon further inspection, she noticed she was a nursing momma cat. After looking around, the young lady had found 10 kittens. All the kittens were sick, but with the right love and care, their upper respiratory infections were cured! The kittens were taken to get combo tested, and two of the kittens tested positive for FeLV. This is how these lovely girls became Town Cats!

They are just as sweet, cuddly, and playful as your "average" kitten! I was lucky enough to spend time with them earlier and they were so much fun to watch! They chase their toys, they play wrestle, and yes, THEY WALK ON A LEASH!!

So what is FeLV? Colleen Hickman of Colorado Animal Rescue gives wonderful information:

"Feline Leukemia Virus (FeLV) is a retrovirus that causes a variety of diseases in cats by invading and replicating itself inside of living cells, making it impossible to cure. In most infected cats, FeLV results in a weaker immune system, making them more vulnerable against common infections.

FeLV is exclusive to cats – only found in 1-2% of cats worldwide – and does not pose a risk to other types of animals or people. New research suggests that adult cats are naturally immune to retroviruses like FeLV. The most common transmission is from mom to kittens and from deep, penetrating bite wounds from other cats. Outdoor cats tend to be at a greater risk of exposure due to their lifestyle.

DESPITE HOW SCARY FELV MAY SOUND, IT IS IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THAT AN FELV CAT CAN LIVE A NORMAL LIFE FOR MANY YEARS WITHOUT ILLNESS.

Cats with FeLV will live normal, healthy and active lives for prolonged periods of time, living up to 4 years or more after diagnosis. They will have their own unique personality for you to learn all about, and want to play, snuggle, eat and sleep just like any other cat.

The best situation for an FeLV-infected cat is to live in a clean, indoor-only environment and be the only cat in the household. You can, however, easily enjoy a multi-pet household since FeLV+cats can live with other species – so no worries if you have a home with dogs, bunnies, birds and so on because they are not susceptible to the FeLV virus."

What does it mean to have a FeLV+ cat? Ms. Hickman provides insight to this as well: "FeLV+ cats... can live a happy life just like any other cat, and deserve just as much love, if not more. Many people who adopt and care for FeLV+ cats find it to be an incredibly positive and rewarding experience, and often stick to adopting FeLV+ cats for this reason."

Do you have the purr-fect home for a FeLV+ cat? Ask yourself these questions:

- 1.Do you have a home without any other cats?
- 2.If you have another cat, are they also FeLV+?
- 3.Can you support regular vet visits and bills?

- 4. Can you access and provide a nutritionally balanced diet?
- 5. Are you able to provide an indoor-only, clean environment?
- 6. Are you willing to make time for play and affection?

If you answered "yes" to the above questions, you should consider adopting a FeLV+ cat!

Finally, Ms. Hickman provides one more important piece of advice: "Many people falsely assume that FeLV+ cats are sick and dying, and that they have no quality of life. Because of this misunderstanding, FeLV+ cats are often overlooked among other cats at the time of adoption. The reality is, however, that cats who are FeLV+ can remain healthy for years after their diagnosis. So, if you are considering adoption and meet a cat with a wonderful personality, don't let FeLV stop you from taking your furry partner in crime home. Whatever length their life ends up being, they are just as deserving of one that is filled with love." (emphasis added)

WINTER TIPS FOR COMMUNITY CATS



- Shelters can be made from storage totes. You can buy one from Town Cats or make one of your own
- Use straw (not HAY) for bedding
- Add a Snuggle Safe heating disc (available at chewy.com)
- · Add kitten food (more calories) and canned food (easier to digest)
- Use deeper water bowls or heated water bowls (if electric is available)
- Create an awning or covered feeding station for added protection
- Remove accumulated snow from shelter areas so cats don't get trapped
- Make noise before starting car!



A LETTER FROM SUSAN MOHLER

PRESIDENT, TOWN CATS, INC.

I would like to begin by thanking all of the Town Cats donors and supporters who have helped us through 2021. We couldn't have made it without you.

2021 has been a challenging year for Town Cats. The Pandemic of 2020 caused a backup of the spay/neuter runs due to the clinics being closed or hours being severely reduced. We are finally catching up with the backlog of cats requiring this service.

In April, we learned of an urgent situation where 20+ cats needed to be trapped and rescued. Six of the cats were pregnant, resulting in 28 kittens being born shortly after trapping. Our amazing Town Cat Volunteers stepped up to foster these cats in their own homes, since Town cats does not have a physical location such as many rescue groups have. Many of these cats and kittens were adopted during the July and September Petsmart adoption event. These cats were just part of the close to 200 cats that Town Cats has rescued so far this year. This is why spaying and neutering is so important, and together we can stop the cycle of the Here's to a successful 2022! cat overpopulation and the suffering they endure.

All cats placed for adoption (whether in a home, as barn cats, or returned to a colony) have been spayed/neutered, given all necessary vaccines, flea treatment, dewormed, combo tested and any other medical care that is necessary. The basic medical cost for each cat is approximately \$150.

Town Cats would not be able to provide the care given to these cats if it were not for the generosity of our donors. They support us in many ways, from making a purchase/ donation at the Town Cats table located at the Ocean Pines Farmer's Market every Saturday, to taking a chance on the quilt raffle tickets (always a big hit). Our annual events, such as the twice yearly yard sales and the Convention Center Expos are always popular fundraisers, as well. Donations of food/ supplies are always welcome.

personally, would thank the TownCat Volunteers for the tireless work they do. Whether it be trapping, transporting cats on the spay/neuter runs/medical visits, fostering or taking care of the cats up for adoption at Petsmart—the volunteers give of their personal time and expense, and we couldn't do it without them.
